



Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

GSD SUMMER COURSE

- **Who can attend?**

GSD Summer course is designed for high-school students from 16 to 19 years old who intend to study International Relations at university level.

- **How does a typical day look like?**

A typical day of the programme will be: arrival at 9:00. Lectures in the mornings. We will have distributed reading material and references prior to the lecture. Short breaks. Lunch in the park where we are located (students must bring their own picnic). In the afternoons, there will be some visits to international organizations, diplomatic missions, NGOs. We will also develop group activities. For instance, we will ask groups to study one issue, organize meetings with experts on that issue, and do a presentation to the others.

- **Is a Certificate issued at the end of the course?**

On the last day we will have an "official" closing of the course with delivery of a Certificate of attendance.

- **Is there a dress code?**

There is no dress code. However, a number of official visits are scheduled.

- **Are activities planned after 5:00 pm?**

This is a day programme. There is no activity planned after school.

- **Is accommodation provided?**

Accommodation is not provided. However, we can help in finding accommodation.

- **What is the admission process?**

The admission process is first in- first served. However, we will not take more than 20 students. Registration is confirmed once payment is made.

- **Can I use public transport to get to the school?**

There are 2 direct buses from Geneva train station (Gare Cornavin). Bus Z and V.
Duration: 10 min.

- **Do I have to prepare for the programme?**

Participants will receive a full package with detailed information and reading material prior to the course, once they have paid the tuition and are fully registered. The more you know about International Relations and the work of the United Nations, the more you will benefit from the course.
